Students wishing to pursue this certification must be in the process of obtaining or already have an initial certification. The requirements for each candidate will depend on the academic background of the candidate and the university and state requirements in effect at the time of admission. If you are interested in pursuing a Master's degree at the same time you are pursuing your certification, please see the World Languages program director.

You must achieve a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.75 in all professional education coursework. This includes any transfer course work that is counted towards certification at UWM, as well as grades earned in student teaching or field experiences.

- Current TB test submitted to the Office of Clinical Experiences.
- Current Criminal Bureau Check (CBC) submitted to the Office of Clinical Experiences.
