Applicants seeking licensure who already hold a Master's Degree are not required to complete a second graduate degree. They may register for all of the required course work as Non Degree Candidates (NDC) and be recommended for the appropriate license upon its successful completion. Work completed prior to beginning certification at UWM may be applied toward certification requirements as appropriate. There is no grade-point average admission requirement for NDC status.

Completion of the Master's Degree in the Department of Administrative Leadership will meet Wisconsin academic requirements for certification as principal, Director of Special Education and Pupil Services, Director of Instruction, or School Business Administrator only if the program includes the specific courses required by the Certification Code.

Completion of the Specialist certificate will meet Wisconsin academic requirements for certification as a superintendent only if the program includes specific courses required by the certification code. If certification is a goal, advisors must be notified in order to insure that all required course work is included in a program.
